

Understanding dental, vision & hearing coverage

If dental, vision, and hearing coverage is not included with your current insurance plan, you can still get coverage. Traditional Medicare and most Medicaid plans do not cover routine dental, vision, or hearing care—however, this care is very important to your overall health.

How to get coverage

There are several possible ways to get dental, vision, or hearing coverage. Your insurance coordinator can help you understand your options and eligibility.



Medicare Advantage—many Medicare Advantage plans include coverage for dental, vision, and hearing—plus additional benefits that vary by plan. If you're on dialysis and have traditional Medicare, you are eligible for Medicare Advantage. Learn more by visiting FreseniusKidneyCare.com/MA

Standalone coverage plans—offered by many private insurance providers, these are separate plans you can purchase directly. If you want to keep your current coverage, adding standalone dental, vision, and hearing coverage could be a good option.

Commercial coverage—commercial or private insurance plans are offered through your employer or purchased through the <u>Healthcare.gov</u> marketplace and typically include dental, vision, and hearing coverage. If you already have commercial coverage, keeping it could be your best option. **Learn more by visiting** FreseniusKidneyCare.com/Employer-Plans
